


# THE LATHAM FOUNDATION INTERNATIONAL HUMANE POSTER CONTEST

#### NOTICE ON SCHOLARSHIPS

All high school students are eligible for the art scholarships, and, if seniors, can make use of their awards when leaving high school.

Those who are not seniors will also be eligible for summer school scholarships. These scholarships have proven of great help and value.

Only students who will be able to begin their studies in 1955 will be eligible for an art scholarship.

#### The Paasche Awards

Special prizes are being awarded for Contest Posters that feature the Airbrush technique. The entire poster does not need to be done with the Airbrush but the art work should make use of airbrushing to enhance the appearance of the poster. This part of the contest is open to high school, art school, amateur and professional artists.

#### THE PURPOSE

All posters are retained and organized into traveling exhibits for display in the United States, Canada, and other countries.





#### SCHOOL ARTS AWARDS

Due to their popularity in the 29th Poster Contest, twice as many Art Books will be awarded this year by School Arts Magazine. These attractive books are awarded for outstanding posters entered by High School students.

#### THE HELEN MACKAY MEMORIAL AWARDS

The Mackay Awards are made to contestants working under some type of physical handicap. Posters in this group should be identified with contestant's name, age, address and school, if attending one. On the back of the poster the type of handicap can be indicated.

> First Prize \$30.00 Three Second Prizes \$20.00 Each Twelve Third Prizes \$5.00 Each

Also, as a Supreme Prize, one complete Correspondence Course sponsored by Art Instruction, Inc.

#### FOREIGN AWARDS

Interest on the part of contestants in other countries is constantly growing. Valuable cash awards will be made for entries from foreign countries. Entries from each country will be judged separately.

Strong mailing tubes should be used for shipping small numbers of posters from overseas points.

#### RULES OF THE CONTEST

SIZE OF CARD: Posters to be 14 x 22 or 12 x 18 inches, used vertically. Designs running horizontally will not be considered. These measurements include any margin. The 14 x 22 inch size is preferred.

MATERIAL: Bristol Board, Illustration Board or any paper of similar weight. No Heavy Cardboard will be accepted.

MEDIUM: Tempera or show-card colors, crayons, water colors or ink. LETTERING: A brief slogan, appropriate to the illustration, should be used. Students are encouraged to devise their own slogans. Avoid fanciful lettering. ALL ILLUSTRATIONS MUST BE ORIGINAL.

IDENTIFICATION: Name in full, complete school address and group must be printed neatly on the face of the poster, in the lower right-hand corner. Names on posters with dark backgrounds can be lettered on small slips of white paper and pasted onto the lower corner of the poster. Teachers should print students' names on posters where students are not able to print them clearly.

Art School and College students must identify their posters with name in full, name of school, Home address, and Group 5.

Professional Artists should identify their posters with name and address. SCHOLARSHIPS: students competing for Art Scholarships should identify their posters on the front as outlined above and also print on the back of their posters their HOME address, name of teacher, and name of Art School they could attend if winning an award.

NUMBER OF ENTRIES: each contestant may enter as many posters as desired, not to exceed four.

SHIPPING: posters must be sent FLAT, well packed to prevent damage in transit. At least two pieces of corrugated board, each as large as the posters, are recommended. Please do NOT attach paper flaps or covers to posters as these delay judging.

Where a package contains posters from more than one school, the posters of each school should be placed together. Where a school's entries include posters in more than one Group, the posters of each Group should be placed together.

TIME OF DELIVERY: posters must be received not later than March 1, 1955. To avoid expensive air shipment charges, send posters early.

WHERE SENT: posters should be addressed to John de Lemos, Box 1322, Stanford, California. Posters sent with express charges collect will not be

NO POSTERS WILL BE RETURNED.

REPORT OF JUDGING: prizes and list of award winners will be issued about May 15th. Report will be mailed to those sending a 3-cent stamp. Do not send stamped envelopes not include stamps in packages of posters.
